#### 1.0 Executive Summary

The *Health Carnival 2025*, held on **Sunday, October 19, 2025**, was a landmark public health and community outreach initiative designed to promote health awareness, provide essential preventive and screening services, and support educational and social development within the Thikkodai community.

Organized by the **Regional Director of Health Services (RDHS), Batticaloa**, and coordinated by **Our Society – Batticaloa**, with full sponsorship from **Our Society – Australia**, the event took place from **8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.** at **BT/PD/Thikkodai Ganesha Vidyalayam**.

A total of **750 beneficiaries** from the local population benefited from the event, which offered an integrated package of **medical**, **educational**, **and family support services**. Notably, **385 individuals** were screened for **Non-Communicable Diseases** (NCDs), **272 for eye conditions**, and several were referred for further care after the detection of suspected cases of **hypertension**, **diabetes**, **breast cancer**, **and leprosy**.

In addition, the carnival provided career motivation sessions for 100 students, distributed books, toys, and clothing to underprivileged families, and strengthened community well-being through inclusive participation.

The event was powered by **120 committed human resources**, including health professionals, volunteers, and students, and utilized **three vehicles** for logistics and transportation. Total financial expenditure amounted to **LKR 141,290**, fully sponsored by *Our Society – Australia*.

This collaborative effort successfully bridged healthcare gaps, enhanced educational support, and promoted social empowerment — setting a replicable model for sustainable community development in Sri Lanka.

#### 2.0 Beneficiary Details

A total of **750 community members** from Thikkodai and nearby areas participated in and benefited from the carnival. Beneficiaries included **families**, **students**, **women**, **children**, **and individuals with special needs**.

Outreach was conducted via **mobile announcements, temple notices, WhatsApp posters, and printed flyers** to ensure equitable access to all community members.

#### 3.0 Detailed Breakdown of Services

#### 3.1 Health Services

- NCD Screening (Blood Pressure, Blood Glucose, BMI): 385 screened; 25 suspected diabetes cases, 20 hypertension, 5 obesity. All received lifestyle counselling and referrals.
- **OPD Consultations:** Approximately 200 patients treated by medical officers.
- **Breast Examination:** 54 women screened; 2 suspected cases referred to Base Hospital, Batticaloa.
- **Leprosy Screening:** 19 screened; 1 suspected case referred for MDT initiation.
- Oral Screening: 30 examined; treated for caries and gingivitis.
- Eye Screening: 272 examined; 23 cataract referrals, 163 reading glasses distributed.
- Paediatric Consultations: 54 children examined.
- **Student Health Assessments:** 150 students checked for nutrition, vision, and oral health.

#### 3.2 Educational and Family Support Services

- **Motivational Session:** 150 O/L and A/L students participated in career guidance and educational motivation programs.
- **Book Donation:** 200 books and a bookshelf donated to Thikkodai Ganesha Vidyalayam Library.
- **Toy Distribution:** 40 toys given to underprivileged children.
- Clothing Distribution: 25 bundles distributed to needy families.

#### 4. Event Arrangements & Logistics

#### • Refreshments:

- o Fresh milk (for 150 participants) arranged by School SDC.
- o Maravalli (150 portions at 10:30 a.m.) arranged by RDS.
- Lunch (1:00 p.m., 120 portions) provided by RDS.
- **Venue Setup:** Hall preparation, sound system, water supply, sanitation, banners, and signboards were managed collaboratively.

#### 5. Vehicle Utilization

Efficient transport was critical for mobilizing staff, medical equipment, and the dental unit.

#### 7. Financial Expenditure

The total financial expenditure amounted to **LKR 141,290**, fully funded by *Our Society – Australia*.

No government funds were utilized, except for in-kind staff contributions.

The *Health Carnival 2025* was an outstanding success — serving **750 beneficiaries**, identifying **71 high-risk cases**, and fostering **community health literacy and empowerment**.

The initiative effectively combined health, education, and social development in one platform. It demonstrated the power of collaboration between RDHS Batticaloa, Our Society – Batticaloa, and Our Society – Australia, setting a sustainable example for future outreach programs.


The event's legacy continues through ongoing referrals, school resource enhancements, and strengthened community networks for preventive healthcare.
